In 2013 we held our first annual banquet and charity auction. This volunteer driven fundraising activity exceeded all goals for attendance and fundraising. Caldwell Family Centre already enjoys strong commitment from local volunteers who hold a Spring Sale and Christmas Bazaar. The Harvest of Hope Auction provides much needed support to all of our programs.



CFC Program Highlights

Emergency Food Program The CFC Food Bank is open four days a week and provides hampers containing enough food for three days, to people in need. Last year we provided 18,428 hampers, which represents a slight decrease compared to 2012. Hampers are available once or twice per month depending on need. In 2013 76% of hampers distributed were received as the first hamper of the month, and 24% were a second.


Day Program The CFC Day Program is open Monday to Friday and received 27,072 visits in 2013, an average of 104 visits every day that we were open. Through the Day Program, people who use the Centre gain access to *food, computers and the internet, socialization, special activities and a variety of outreach services* from other agencies.

English Language School/Child-Minding This past year, the Language Program operated at full capacity with 85 students passing through the doors. Small class sizes contribute to a family atmosphere where 19 students were successful in moving up a level in their education. Our child-minding facility also provided necessary support to students with young children while they attended class.

Senior's Centre The CFC senior's Centre was opened in 2011 and in the past year we have added exercise classes to the program. Regular crafts and social activities have rounded out the programming for seniors. The seniors centre is also used for weekly cooking classes.

The Caldwell Family Centre also provides services or partners with community agencies to provide the following programs: Christmas Hamper Program, Toy Mountain, ESL Sewing Classes, Homework Help Club, Citizenship Classes and Tax Preparation Clinics.



Profile of the Carlington Community source 2011 census

- Single parent families are 45% of the community compared to 23% in the whole of Ottawa:
- 25% of Carlington Community families have 3 children or more compared to 19% in Ottawa;
- 32% of families in the Carlington Community are "low income families" vs. 11% in Ottawa;
- Early Health Risks: teen births and maternal smoking during pregnancy in the Carlington Community are 3 times the average of these risk factors in Ottawa;
- Child Injury rates (ages 0-18 years) are higher in the Carlington Community than in Ottawa (Unintentional injury is the leading cause of death and hospitalization for Canadian children between the ages of 1 and 14 years. Child injury rates are a way of identifying and monitoring local health and safety concerns, which can support public education, local injury prevention)
- Drug offences since 2006 (up to 2011) have increased by 95.2 % in the Carlington Community compared to a decrease of 5.1% in Ottawa as a whole;
- School Readiness: A high percentage of children are considered vulnerable and at-risk compared to the average in Ottawa.
