One highlight came last June when Caldwell Family Centre hosted a family fun celebration to mark 30 years of serving this community. Everyone came together to enjoy activities on a beautiful day and to mark a significant point in our history.

We are working with all of our agency partners to continually improve: with the Ottawa Food Bank we are improving advocacy and client confidentiality by updating the way we capture food bank usage;

Program Highlights

Emergency Food Program

The CFC Food Bank is open four days a week and provides hampers, containing enough food for three days, to people in need. Last year we provided 18, 819 hampers, which represents a slight increase compared to 2013. One in three people served were children.

Day Program

The CFC Day Program (Thelma's Place) is open Monday to Friday and received 27,266 visits in 2014, up slightly from the previous year. Through the Day Program, people who use the drop in centre to gain access to food, computers and the internet, socialization, special activities and a variety of outreach services from other agencies.

English Language School/Child-Minding

This past year, the Language Program operated at full capacity. The majority of students were female refugees, between the ages of 25-44 with 0-9 years of schooling. The Care for Newcomer Children Program has now incorporated monthly Parent Chats and developmental screening for all children.

Our Mission

The Mission of the Caldwell Family Centre is to provide services which feed and nurture physical and emotional wellness.

Our Vision

The Vision of the Caldwell Family Centre is a strong, healthy, safe, self-sustaining community where the residents are confident, empowered and independent; where those who have need for food, companionship, housing, education, or knowledge are provided for in a coordinated fashion with dignity and responsiveness.

Other

New in 2014 we are now also providing clothing and small household items at deeply reduced prices at the Clothing Depot. Weekly drop-in and cooking classes are provided at our Senior's Centre. Other programs and services provided are: Christmas Hamper Program, Toy Mountain, ESL Sewing Classes, Homework Help Club and tax preparation clinics.

Transition Day Camp

With numerous organizations responding to the needs of low-income families and newcomers to Canada, we recognize that the spirit of cooperation between groups will benefit everyone, especially our constituents. Nineteen years ago, the Children's Village of Ottawa-Carleton developed an innovative program called *Transitions*, a summer camp with a difference for children between the ages of 8 to 12. This summer, the Caldwell Family Centre will be combining resources with the "Village" to offer Transitions in our community.

Transitions is unique in its objectives. It prepares children for the 'transition' from dependence to independence by teaching the skills needed to make a successful life change.

It provides campers with the opportunity to:

- develop self-confidence, independence and responsibility.
- develop healthy co-operative social and working relationships with other children and adults.
- learn time and money management.
- make decisions, plan, and organize all aspects of desired activities.
- explore and utilize the resources within their own community and to be healthy members of the community.

In its small-group format, the children are encouraged to be the Boss. Campers receive a small weekly allowance and bus tickets for outings they organize and plan themselves. Under the guidance of a qualified counsellor, they manage all aspects of the program. The end result is a sense of empowerment, faith in their abilities, and lots of recreational fun.

Since 1854, the Village has been the originator in many progressive programs throughout the childcare community.

Transitions is one of its most successful. The program now operates 15 sites in public housing projects, low-income communities, or in middle-income communities throughout Ottawa-Carleton. Each site program is modified to meet the needs of their community children, with subsidies and financial aid available to those in need.

The Caldwell Family Centre is extremely pleased to offer this exceptional summer camp in conjunction with the Village. We are convinced that this partnership will result in positive changes for the children of our area.
